Operations:

A Shift - Battalion Chief Pearson

- On 01/16, Station 3 hosted the KRDO News 13 morning show and the Battlin' Betties to highlight them and their support for local first responders and military personnel.

B Shift – Battalion Chief Coyle

- On 1/6, MFD crews participated in Red Energy PR videos. Several crew members were interviewed for social media content.
- On 1/6, MFD crews responded to an aircraft emergency. Crews located a small airplane that had a mechanical and landed in a field. No injuries were reported.
- On 1/7, MFD crews responded to a fire from improper disposal of hot coals. Crews found a
 melted trash can with smoke damage to the residence's exterior wall.
- On 1/18, MFD station 1 hosted a ride-along.
- On 1/18, MFD crews responded to a structure fire in subzero temperatures. The home sustained significant smoke and water damage. Two adults, four kids, and one dog were displaced. The homeowner was treated and evaluated on scene for smoke inhalation, and one firefighter was injured. The estimated loss is \$280k.
- On 1/19, MFD Station 4 hosted a ride-along.
- On 1/19, MFD crews responded to Black Forest for a structure fire.
- On 1/25, MFD crews responded to Larkspur for a structure fire. They encountered one patient who was seriously injured by burns.






Incidents by Call Type – January




- Fire calls include structure fires, outside fires, and others.
- Hazardous conditions include spills/leaks, chemical release, electric wiring/equipment problems.
- Public assistance includes a person in distress or assistance required (e.g., lift assist).
- Good intent includes canceled enroute, no emergency fund, and controlled burn.
- Fire alarms include false alarms, system malfunctions, and unintentional system activation.



Incidents – Top 3 Response Categories – January




Ambulance Transports – January





Ambulance Automatic/Mutual Aid – January




Calls are dispatched and enroute, and do not consider cancellations.


MFD to AMR – 0 calls accepted.
